DAILY BIBLE READINGS - Week of January 5, 2025 "Jesus, Our Lord"

GOD'S GLORY

Sunday...... Read Philippians 2:5-15

"And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." To know Jesus personally as Savior is huge, the assurance of an eternal home in heaven and an eternal purpose for our earthly lives. The added blessing is when we make Jesus the Lord of our lives. Having Jesus as our Lord makes us His servants. This gives believers the high privilege of bringing glory to God. FAMILY

Monday Read Matthew 6:6-15

"After this manner therefore pray ye: Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name." God considers all people who have given their hearts to His Son Jesus to be His family. Jesus made that clear when He advised the disciples on their prayers. They were to address God in heaven as their Father. That gives a very special meaning to the decision to receive Christ. Tuesday Read John 15:10-17

"Ye are my friends, if ye do whatsoever I command you." What an amazing statement that Jesus made to His disciples! The fact that it is recorded in the Bible means we can assume it is applicable in our lives. Jesus, God the Son, considers us, as believers, His friends! Friendships are a rich blessing. JOY

Wednesday..... Read Nehemiah 8:8-10

The Holy Spirit dwells in the bodies of all believers. With the Holy Spirit, we are told in Galatians 5:3 that the believer is the beneficiary of spiritual fruits, one of which is joy! FOLLOWER

ThursdayRead Matthew 4:17-22

"And he saith unto them, Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." What a wonderful message Jesus gave to these disciples who were fishermen. He said they could be "fishers of men." Catching fish to bring home for enjoyment at a meal is pleasurable. Convincing others to become followers of Jesus to get them on the road to heaven is a far greater thrill. Handing a gospel tract to someone may be giving them the gift of eternal life, as Philip was led by the Holy Spirit to help the eunuch understand the literature he was reading while traveling back to Africa after a visit to Jerusalem. As we read in Acts 8:31: "And he said, How can I, except some man should guide me? And he desired of Philip that he would come up and sit with him." The eunuch became a follower of God!

FAITH

Friday Mark 11:20-25

"Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them." Prayer is the high privilege of believers! It is a demonstration of our dependence on God, and His desire to respond. God expects us to trust Him, to believe that He hears and answers our prayers. As a Father in heaven, He is willing and able to provide! Being the loving Father that He is, He will not give us things that would harm us. He first and foremost knows what is best, and that is what our Father in heaven wants for us. The prayer of faith is one that we pray trusting God to respond in a way that works for us! PROOF

Saturday Read James 2:15-20

"Yea, a man may say, Thou hast faith, and I have works: shew me thy faith without thy works, and I will shew thee my faith by my works." We prove our faith in God by our actions. If our actions are consistent with God's instructions in the Bible, we are truly demonstrating our faith. Our hunger for Biblical truth is proof of our faith. Those who are eager to read the Bible or listen to others sharing Biblical truth is a demonstration of faith. Those who learn and share Biblical truth are giving evidence of their faith in the Bible.
